### DONATIONS AT WORK -DONALD WEESNER CHARITABLE TRUST

When visiting Dodge Nature Center, you may not consider the contributions that play such a big role in keeping Dodge the safe and inviting place it is for your nature adventures. One such partner, is the Donald Weesner Charitable Trust, which has been making donations to Dodge since 2004. Their two most recent gifts improve the quality experience for everyone visiting Dodge—by repairing the barn roof and re-paving walking pathways that endure heavy use.



Thanks to the Donald Weesner Charitable Trust, the barn roof that was in great need of repair, was re-shingled with cedar. Not an often-used technique on roofs in 2018, it took us a while to find the right vendor. The roof was repaired to its original style, keeping with Olivia Irvine Dodge's vision for the farm at Dodge Nature Center. You can enjoy this nostalgic look whenever you visit the Dodge farm. In addition to looking great, the new shingles provide a safe, dry place for the hay and the animals. Dodge sees thousands of children each year during field trips and farm tours, and the barn is a key feature in their education.

Additionally, watch for new and improved paved pathways near our Marie Avenue parking lot this spring. This will make it easier to walk around near the office, school house, and museum. This area of Dodge sees thousands of footsteps each year with school groups, birthday parties, and hikers enjoying the trails. We are thankful to the Donald Weesner Charitable Trust for this investment to provide safer and walkable pathways to move from building to building.

Jerry has volunteered at Dodge Nature Center for 10+ years. He is enthusiastic, warm, and has a true dedication to Dodge' mission. Jerry comes every day until a project is done (e.g. shutters for the raptors in below zero conditions). He helped construct shutters for the raptor mews, an enclosure for the resident flying squirrel, and hive stands for the bee program. He built more stands for waterers in the chicken coop, and feed boxes for the sheep. He installed lighting in the farm shop, created plans for redoing the lighting in the barn, and secured a safety light so staff can see behind the raptor mews. He also has a plan for cabinets to house the animal mounts. This list is long, and it is only a mere sample that showcases the impact Jerry is making at Dodge as the seasons change. Thank you, Jerry, for being a superhero in the Dodge community.
